Fear Not!

The Association of Presbyterian Church Educators (APCE) invites educators, pastors, volunteers, and students of Christian education to attend the 2015 Annual Event at the Marriott Baltimore Waterfront Hotel in Baltimore, Maryland, February 4–7. The theme of the event is *Fear Not!*, inspired by the prophet Isaiah's challenge and promise, "Do not fear, or be afraid; have I not told you from of old and declared it? You are my witnesses! Is there any god besides me? There is no other rock; I know not one" (Isaiah 44:8).

The 2015 Annual Event co-chairs, Joyce MacKichan Walker and Keith Sundberg, and the Annual Event Ministry Team

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have planned four fantastic days of keynote speakers, table conversations, inspiring worship, and opportunities to network with others who are involved in the educational ministries of the church.

Keynote speakers and preachers include Brian Blount, president of Union Presbyterian Seminary, and Carol Howard-Merritt, author of Tribal Church and Reframing Hope. Katie Geneva Cannon, the Annie Scales Rogers Professor of Christian Ethics at Union Presbyterian Seminary, will provide an in-depth, pre-event seminar, *Fear Not: Embodying the Wisdom Embedded in African Sacred Rhetoric.* William Heard, director of Friends of Jesus Ensemble, will coordinate event music. A variety of off-site excursions, certification courses, pre-event gatherings, and workshops will span the entire week. Come early, and stay late!

Educate a Child, Transform the World

The 221st General Assembly (2014) of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), meeting in Detroit, Michigan, approved an initiative, Educate a Child, Transform the World, to dedicate the next four years to the education of the world's children. The emphasis is one of the ways the denomination hopes to address the root causes of poverty, one of three critical global issues. This education initiative, put forth by the Presbyterian Mission Agency's World Mission and Compassion, Peace, and Justice mission areas, congregations, and partners around the world, invites individuals, churches, and partners -domestically and internationallyto get involved.

The overall goal is to provide safe access to quality education to one million children by:

- Strengthening communities' capacity to provide quality education
- Improving training and resourcing for teachers at all levels
- Creating a safe environment for children, especially girls, to have access to quality education

As noted in a brochure distributed at the assembly, the "Presbyterian Church has a 177-year history of providing educational access for children in the U.S. and around the world. World Mission wants to build on this rich legacy and continue to offer children a future of hope."

The brochure outlined ten ways to become involved in this educational ministry emphasis. Two of the ways may reflect or spur the action of congregations and individuals in your area:

 Host education programs in your church. A pre-school program impacts children during the most important developmental phase of their lives. An afterschool program for elementary school children provides tutoring help and a time for safe play. A wonderful model of this program is the STAIR Program (Start the Adventure in Reading) established in New Orleans by the Presbyterian Action Council: stairnola.org. Another program your congregation may want to examine is Kids Hope USA: kidshopeusa.org.

• Engage with advocacy efforts of PC(USA) World Mission Networks and PC(USA) to urge governments to dedicate a significant share of available revenues to finance primary education. See EFA Policy Paper #8: unesco.org/ images/0022/002204/220443E. pdf.
