

A REFORMED POINT OF VIEW

There are many different ways to evaluate curriculum. This form will help your committee or small group look for examples of teaching and learning activities that are distinctly *Reformed*. Use this process to evaluate curricula from a variety of publishers, including online resources.

Ask each person in your small group or committee to select a different item in the curriculum line or from different publishers to evaluate. Review the teaching/learning activities in your particular curriculum piece that illustrate the following theological concepts, consistent with the Reformed tradition. Pick any five to explore. Be ready to share what you discover with your group or committee.

1. All persons of the Trinity are included: God, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit.
2. Materials from both the Old and New Testament are studied.
3. God's grace is central.
4. Jesus Christ's humanity and his divinity are illustrated.
5. The concept of serving God through serving others is evident.
6. Illustrations, examples, and language treat all persons with respect.
7. There are references to Reformed worship and the sacraments.

When each small group is finished with their review, share your examples of Reformed identity in the curriculum piece you selected.
