

Basic Guide for Finding Scope, Sequence, and Samples

Two of the most frequently asked questions about curriculum are these:

Which stories and Scripture passages does this curriculum cover?
Can I get samples of the curriculum to review with my teachers?

When people ask about the stories and Scriptures in a curriculum, they want to know “the scope and sequence” of stories and Bible verses. Thanks to the Internet and publishers’ websites, it is easy to find scope, sequence, and samples. Publishers post the biblical scope, sequence, and sample sessions online for each curriculum line.

Here is one example of how to visit a website and navigate for scope and sequence and samples: Congregational Ministries Publishing (CMP).

Start the search on the CMP home page at pcusa.org/curriculum. You can locate and review CMP’s curricula in two ways:

- Click on a specific curriculum logo on the home page, such as the *We Believe* icon.
- Click on an age group or language tab on the left side of the home page and select the icon for curriculum you want to view. If you select early childhood, children, youth, adults, or language resources, you will find a variety of curricula to explore.

The Growing in Grace & Gratitude URL for early childhood and children is growinggracegratitude.org. You will find the biblical scope and sequence and sample sessions for each age group, including the Leader’s Materials, Stories, Colors, and More, and Grace Sightings.
