Plans for Curriculum Interpretation

POINT Representatives, who attended the POINT Topic Forum in Baltimore, brainstormed action plans for introducing and interpreting *Growing in Grace & Gratitude*. Review their list of ideas and create your own plan to inform congregations in your area.

- Learn as much as you can about the curriculum—its features, components, formats, and prices—from the curriculum website at growinggracegratitude.org, the curriculum catalog, curriculum brochures, and other promotional tools
- Download and become familiar with the age level samples or order the free Sample Sunday booklet
- Invite a CMP representative to come and do a workshop in your area, including but not limited to, the following:
 - Pre-presbytery workshop
 - Introduce curriculum as part of a presbytery meeting
 - Provide a display, with samples and information about the curriculum
 - Offer a workshop at an educators' group or other leadership event
- If trained by taking a workshop at APCE or another event, adapt your experience as a workshop to present at your church or for a cluster of churches
- Provide a written report about the curriculum to presbytery as an online recommendation
- Promote in newsletters and e-bulletins through resource centers or as part of presbytery communications and packets
- Save and resend or forward The POINT Connection e-news or printed quarterly POINT Network News articles and curriculum information

Plans for Curriculum Interpretation, continued

- Promote through social media—email, Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube
- Create and conduct a webinar
- Distribute samples, fliers, and copies
- Post the curriculum logos on the presbytery website
- Send the curriculum introductory tip sheet found in the POINT Ministry Guide, Section Two
- Have a conversation with people in your presbytery about why the theme and name of grace and gratitude
- Inform congregations that *We Believe* is ending and that *Growing in Grace & Gratitude* is the new children's curriculum option for our denomination (in addition to *Feasting on the Word Curriculum* in partnership with PPC)
- Encourage congregations to participate in sample Sunday, to give the curriculum a try without obligation
- Meet with C. E. elders, commissioned ruling elders, pastors, and volunteers in the presbytery to introduce the curriculum, with suggestions for adapting for a variety of contexts and settings

Flipping the Classroom, 1.0

A conversation about flipped instruction—the concept of moving from teacher-centered models to child, youth, and adult motivated experiences—took place at the Association of Presbyterian Church Educators (APCE) in Baltimore. Some of the history, the basics, and general research of flipped classroom instruction were shared, along with practical examples and an extensive bibliography.

One result of the workshop was the buzz! People left the room talking about next steps. Those who have tried the model before left with the desire to try again. Other participants, those who knew a little about flipping the classroom, expanded their tool kits. Attendees who never heard about the concept were introduced to the range of possibilities. Mostly people discovered that flipped instruction happens when opportunities are provided for exploring faith outside the church.

The questions asked were another important part of the conversation.

- If other institutions around the country are turning education upside down, pushing it out the door into the home and community, why not the church?
- What can congregations do to get onboard?
- How can churches design ministry that is more about the individual and less about the location?
- What are our ideas for flipping classrooms in faith communities?


Being Reformed: Call to Mission
