Celebrate the Church's birthday

At home

Pentecost, the Sunday at the end of the 50 days of Eastertide, is the birthday of the Christian church. All over the world Christians celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, just as Jesus promised, to be with all disciples. Let the party begin!

Invite your family to bake and decorate a cake with red, yellow, and orange icing to represent the images of flames and fire at the first Pentecost celebration.

Place a candle for each member of the family on top of the cake. Invite each person to light a candle, and to name one gift or talent the Holy Spirit gave them to show God's love. Help the little ones in your family to participate.

Through ritual

- * Close your eyes for a breath prayer, silently inviting God's spirit to fill you as you breathe in and sending God's spirit into the world as you exhale.
- * Celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit by running and catching the wind or blowing on a pinwheel. Watch it spin. Imagine God's spirit filling you with power.

Galatians 5:22–23 lists the gifts of the Holy Spirit as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Use these gifts to show God's love to each child, teen, and adult in your school.

At work

Unleash the power of the Holy Spirit to navigate the complexity of your work

environment. If you need wisdom to deal with difficult employee, ask the Holy Spirit for guidance. If you need to speak the truth to power, invite the Spirit to bless the conversation.

In the world

Each morning pray, "Spirit, show me this day how to be God's love in the world."

Each night pray, "Spirit, thank you for helping me today to be God's love in the world."
