Subject: A recommendation for the Presbyterian Mission Agency to become an official member of the We Will Speak Out campaign

Recommendation:

That the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board approve membership in We Will Speak Out, a faith-based coalition working together to spark a movement to end sexual violence in the U.S. and the world.

Background:

We Will Speak Out is a global faith-based campaign to end violence against women. http://wewillspeakout.us/ and http://www.wewillspeakout.org/ In short, We Will Speak Out advocates for churches to lead the way to end violence against women by resourcing congregations as well as acting and advocating for change.

In the past months, many offices have been working together to create movement around violence against women and have pledged their support including the Office of Public Witness, the Presbyterian Ministry to the United Nations, Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries, Theology & Education, Advocacy Committee for Women's Concerns, the Presbyterians Against Domestic Violence Network, Presbyterian Women, and Presbyterian Men. We see this as an effective way to support congregations in their efforts as we move forward into a broader movement that includes children. We hope this will be one option we can present to congregations to address the critical global initiative of ending violence against women and children.

Current coalition members include The World Council of Reformed Churches, World Vision International, International Medical Assistance (IMA) World Health, the Episcopal Church, the Mennonite Central Committee, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the Lutheran World Federation, the Disciples of Christ Week of Compassion and Jewish Women International.

The cost for a non-profit organization of our size is \$2,500. This financial commitment allows for communication staff to resource with development of educational tools for congregations and Christian schools, staffing, and support for constituents as we have needs.
