REPORT C.101 - MINUTES

The Leadership Committee **VOTED to approve** the Leadership Committee Minutes of September 23, 2015.

That the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board approve the Theology, Formation and Evangelism Ministry portion of the Presbyterian Mission Agency report and forward to the 222nd GA (2016).

REPORT C.103 – "EMPOWERED & The Leadership Committee **VOTED to approve the following recommendation:**

HOPEFUL" – WOMEN OF COLOR CONSULTATION REPORT

That the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board on behalf of the Women of Color Consultation planning team recommends that the 222nd General Assembly (2016):

- 1. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency through Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries to continue to sponsor racial ethnic and women's leadership institutes to develop women of color leaders in the church, so that they will have opportunities to serve fully in ministry and leadership.
- 2. Direct the Presbyterian Mission Agency through Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries to continue to provide and support opportunities for women of color to attend trainings and professional development events.

Prior to the committee voting to approve the recommendation, Mara Rivera, a participant in the Women of Color Consultation, spoke on behalf of Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministry (REWM).

REPORT C.104 – APPROVAL OF WOMEN OF FAITH AWARD NOMINEES The Leadership Committee **VOTED to approve the following** recommendation:

That the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board approve the nominees for the Women of Faith awards and forward this on to the 222nd GA (2016), in order to recognize these Women of Faith award recipients.

REPORT C.105 – PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN – ORGANIZATION FOR MISSION AMENDMENT The Leadership Committee **VOTED** to approve the following recommendation:

That the Presbyterian Mission Agency Board approve and forward the following recommendation to the General Assembly:

That the 222^{nd} General Assembly (2016) amend the *Organization for Mission* in the following ways:

1. Delete the word "related" in the title to Section VIII, so that it would read:

VIII. Other General Assembly Related-Corporations

2. Add a new Section IX as follows, renumbering the remaining sections:

IX. Corporations Related to the General Assembly

Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Inc.

Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Inc. (PW) is organized and operated to be an inclusive, caring community of women, forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit, that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) (the Church) and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom by nurturing faith through prayer and Bible study, supporting the mission of the Church worldwide, and working for justice and peace. Members of Presbyterian Women are first and foremost members of the Church. The organization is structured at the congregation, presbytery, synod, and national levels in order to support the Church at each level.

PW is an integrated auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). PW is not subordinate to the General Assembly. PW's Certificate of Incorporation includes a Statement of Faith which provides that PW holds to the doctrines and principles of the Reformed tradition as expressed in the Church's Constitution. PW is related to the Presbyterian Mission Agency through an agreement which is reviewed and approved by the General Assembly every four years.

VERBAL REPORT – MILITARY CHAPLAINS

The Leadership Committee **VOTED to approve the following recommendation:**

That the Leadership Committee appoint Harold Delhagen to engage in a conversation with the Stated Clerk's Office, the Executive Director of the PMA or designee, and the appropriate staff of the Theology, Formation, and Evangelism Ministry Area regarding the possibility of sharing responsibility for endorsing chaplains from PCCMP to the Office of the Stated Clerk and report back to the April meeting.

Prior to the motion being made and voted for approval, Larry Greenslit, Director of Presbyterians Caring for Chaplains and Military Personnel (PCCMP), updated the committee on news from the PCCMP.

Larry Greenslit presented a written report. He summarized accomplishments of the past year, and outlined what the PCCMP faces in the future. Unlike PW, PCCMP is a creation of the General Assembly (GA). Larry feels that has gotten lost somehow. PCCMP agency of four Presbyterian denominations. Created by and accountable to GA. Board

composed of elected representatives of GA.

REPORT C.200 – CELEBRATE THE GIFTS OF WOMEN Rhashell Hunter and Sera Chung presented Report C.200. Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday is March 6, 2016. This year's reflection entitled "A Worship to Inherit," written by Sera Chung, was made available online November 2015 for download from www.pcusa.org/women.

REPORT C.201 – PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN UPDATE Carol Winkler presented the report and reviewed the purpose of the Presbyterian Women, how PW supports the mission of the church, has adopted the Educate a Child Initiative as a triennial goal, planning Together in Action Days in May. Additionally, PW has cross-ministry roundtables, including Human Trafficking Roundtable, Ending Sexual Violence Roundtable, End Child Prostitution and Trafficking (ECPAT), and Justice and Peace Roundtable. PW strives to build inclusive community.

REPORT C.202 – RACIAL ETHNIC & NEW IMMIGRANT SEMINARIANS CONFERENCE Jewel McRae reported on the Racial Ethnic and New Immigrant Seminarians annual conference. It was held October 23-25, 2015 at the Alex Haley Farm related to the Children's Defense Fund. The mission of the Racial Ethnic and New Immigrant Seminarians Conference was to join in community with other church leaders in a spiritual environment to engage in vocational discernment, discuss issues facing them as racial ethnic and new immigrant seminarians, learn about the connectional church, prepare for ministry, and to build and deepen relationships. The theme was "Discovering the Missiological Challenges of the Church in the 21st Century."

REPORT C.203 – MISSION CO-WORKER HANDBOOK UPDATE REGARDING MISSION PERSONNEL ACTIONS Nancy Cavalcante reported that the Mission Co-Worker Handbook was updated to reflect a change in the approval process for "Actions" for Mission Personnel, previously approved at the September 2015 Presbyterian Mission Agency Board meeting.

REPORT C.204 – MISSION PERSONNEL ACTIONS

Nancy Cavalcante reported current Mission Personnel "Actions" that were previously approved by the World Mission Leadership Team. Two featured Mission Personnel were Rev. David Cortes-Fuentes and Josey Saez-Acevedo.

REPORT C.205 – YOUNG ADULT VOLUNTEER PROGRAM SUMMARY AND UPDATES Richard Williams, Lydia Kim, and Tisha Mason reported on the Young Adult Volunteer Program.

Tisha, a student at McCormick Theological Seminary and YAV alum, reported on how YAV shaped where she is now.

Lydia Kim reported that the YAV racial-ethnic participation increased from 13% (2014-15) to 21% (2015-16). In addition, a discussion on racism was included in the intake interview process for YAVs.

REPORT C.206 – THEOLOGY AND WORSHIP UPDATE Charles Wiley reported on two items:

• Financial Aid for Service forgave \$40,000 in loans to pastors serving PC (USA) congregations, as well as added a partnership

with Women's Leadership Development and Young Women's Ministries.

•

The Theological Conversations initiative was launched mid-2015.
 A paper is released bi-monthly, with theological questions added at the end and a one-hour Twitter conversation, to launch theological engagement opportunities.

VERBAL REPORT –
RACIAL ETHNIC
LEADERSHIP
DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Vince Patton reported on the Racial Ethnic Leadership Development events in 2015. All 13 offices in REWM engaged in Leadership work, totaling more than 45 events to equip them with skills to affect change in their communities. In 2015, REMW provided staff support for the Study on the Status of Women Project and facilitated several women's listening visits with women leaders across the church. Research from the Study on the Status of Women should be made available this spring. REWM had two collective goals in 2015: (1) staff launched a Speak Antiracism campaign, and (2) staff assisted in developing and implementing a funds development plan for REWM to aid in racial ethnic and new immigrant worshiping communities and racial ethnic leadership development, in conjunction with a designated funds development manager (Lydia Bailey Brown). Also in 2015, the ministry area transitioned from Multicultural Ministries to Intercultural Ministries. A Presbyterian Intercultural Young Adult Network at Big Tent (2015). In 2016, Vince's office will shift focus to racial ethnic recruitment.
